## **Background**

November 2005: EPWS legally established in Brussels with EU funding, as an international non-profit association (AISBL), with an international Board of Administration, (3 of the 11 are physicists).

#### General Assemblies:

1st in Brussels - 2007

2<sup>nd</sup> in Vilnius - 2008

Since 2008 EPWS has relied on its members' voluntary efforts.

3rd in Brussels - 2009

4th in Brussels - 2010

5th will be in Budapest - 2011



A Structural Link - for women scientists and policy makers



## **Disciplines of Member Networks**






## **Networking the Networks**

at the macro level as well as to individual research institutions on the micro level.




## A network for all members

6% of EPWS members are mentoring based organisations. **Mentoring** for women can be life changing Examples:


