“for her work on the life of stars from the birth of the universe to the present time”
- *Pr. Athene M. Donald* *for EUROPE*
Professor of Experimental Physics at the Cavendish Laboratory in the Department of Physics at the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom.
“for her work in unravelling the mysteries of the physics of messy materials, ranging from cement to starch.”
- *Pr. Akiko Kobayashi* *for ASIA (OCEANIA and PACIFIC)*
Professor and Chair of the Department of Chemistry, College of Humanities and Sciences at Nihon University in Japan.
“for her contribution to the development of molecular conductors and the design and synthesis of a single-component molecular metal”
- *Pr. Eugenia Kumacheva* *for NORTH AMERICA (Canada and USA)*
Professor in the Department of Chemistry at the University of Toronto in Canada.
“for the design and development of new materials with many applications including targeted drug delivery for cancer treatments and materials for high density optical data storage”
- *Pr. Tebello Nyokong* *for AFRICA and ARAB STATES*
Professor in the Department of Chemistry at Rhodes University in South Africa.
“for her work on harnessing light for cancer therapy and for environmental clean-up”

The Awards ceremony will take place on Thursday 5th March, 2009 and will be presided by the Jury President, Professor Ahmed ZEWAİL.
