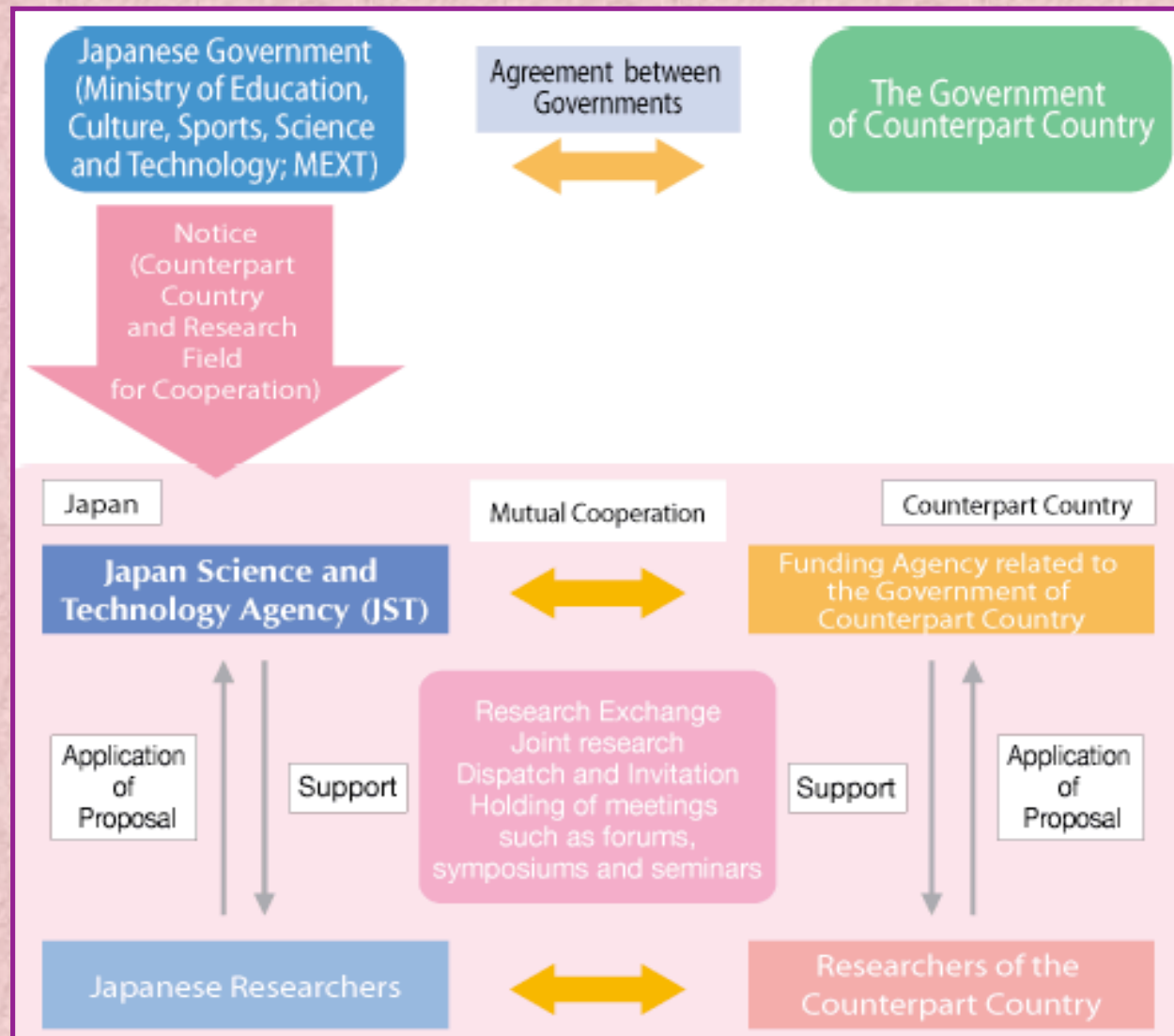

Strategies of fund-raising in general

- Being a PI, keep research at certain level
- Be active in the local Physical Society
- Team-up with other PI's, local or international
- Try various channels for funding

Women-In-Physics related funding

- Project for travel grant*
- Project for hosting local/international meetings*
- Project for the yearly activities of working group*
- Project related to Women-In-Physics studies

Strategy for Women-in-Physics fund-raising

- Form a working group of 5-9 and include male members
--- easier to ask funding as a team.
- Associate with the local Physical Societies.
--- become an official committee with regular funding.
- Talk to some funding agencies related to women-foundation
--- set-up some award/scholarship/research-grand.
- Stay closely with the international W-I-P activity
--- networking is important for information exchange and international cooperation.

Fund-Raising experiences at Taiwan for Women-in-Physics (1)

- National Science Council
 - Obtain partial travel grand for a team of 5+2 attended “IUPAP Women-in-Physics” conference in Paris (2002) and 6+2 in Seoul (2008).
 - Obtain a full grand for a team of 6+2 to attended “2007 Asian Forum on Women-in-Physics” together with APCTP annual meeting in Pohang, Korea.
 - Granted for organizing the annual “Symposium for Taiwan Female Physicists” since 2002.

Fund-Raising experiences at Taiwan for Women-in-Physics (2)

- National Science Council (continue)
 - Making a film of 40 min. to introduce the 10 outstanding women Physicists at Taiwan: a sub-proposal included in the Project of 2005 Einstein Year.
 - For Gender-technology studies: a research proposal is granted in 2008 to collect some data of Women-in-Science and to hold the first Symposium for Taiwan female technologists (09/20/2008).

Fund-Raising experiences in Taiwan for Women-in-Physics (2)

- Academia Sinica / Physics Institute
 - For travel Grant: the support of two physicists to attend the IUPAP-Women-in-Physics conference in 2002 and 2008.
- Physical Society at China-Taipei
 - Setting-up the scholarship of Wu-Chien-Shiung: a constant money of ~ 3200 US \$ per year to award the excellent female Physics students at master/Ph.D level since 2003.
 - Hosting regular workshop by Working Committee on WIP (7+2) since 2007, “Workshop on Challenges of Physicists.”
